In 2024, our community turned stories into strength.

Together, we reached more than 1,000 children living in children's homes and special schools across India—through 17 Bookwallah Imagination Havens (libraries) filled with storybooks, color and courage. Week after week, these spaces came alive with laughter, hope and belonging.

We opened The Library of Flowers in Mumbai—thanks to generous donors like SobaCares and celebrated a young girl's journey from the streets of Mumbai to the international stage.

We piloted a Leadership and Internship program for children who grew up with Bookwallah. Volunteer Story Ambassadors brought compassion to even the darkest corners.

Our psychology research assessment continues to evolve and show measurable gains in hope and self-perception, providing evidence that stories don't just inspire—they transform ...and...with more time, more children will heal through this safe, positive method.

From my new home in Porto, Portugal (more central), I've observed how far this spirit travels—across continents, cultures, and hearts—reminding me that imagination and stories know no borders.

Through it all, one truth remained: when a community shows up, it tells a child of trauma, that the world still holds kindness—and that they too are worthy of love.

Thank you for believing in children's dreams and helping us build an Empire of **Hope** -that reaches beyond borders.

THE CHILDREN WE CHAMPION

Healing trauma through the power of stories.

Across the world, more than 175 million children live with the deep, invisible wounds of trauma.

Through your support, Bookwallah reaches those most vulnerable:

- Children who have survived abuse and neglect
- Victims of trafficking and exploitation
- Children orphaned by conflict, disease, or disaster
- Children of farmers who died by suicide
- Children of struggling single parents
- COVID orphans
- Children with HIV/AIDS &/or with disabilities

Trauma reshapes a child's developing brain, making it harder to learn, trust, or regulate emotions. Left unhealed, it can follow them into adulthood — shaping a lifetime of struggle not only for them, but for the world around them.

Bookwallah turns **stories into therapy** to rebuild self-belief and self-worth. Stories like *Beauty and the Beast*, *Giraffes Can't Dance*, and *Angry Aku* do more than entertain. They inspire children to see courage, find resilience, and slowly rebuild & rewire- to shift from victim to survivor to victor.

Our data show this works:

57% of children who experienced trauma show measurable improvement in **hope and/or self-perception** after **just 30 story sessions**.

Each time a child begins to imagine again — to laugh, to dream, to believe — we see the world shift a little closer toward hope. Hope leads to a future filled with new possibilities.



OUR PROGRAMATIC PILLARS – FROM HEALING → TO FLOURISH IN SOCIETY

IMAGINATION HAVEN PROGRAM- LIBRARY STRUCTURE

Our primary objective is to help children of trauma heal through the power of story. We create safe, beautiful, and story-filled spaces, each designed as a sanctuary of color and calm, forming the foundation of their healing journey.

STORY & STORY SPARKLER PROGRAMS

After establishing an Imagination Haven, we bring stories to life through interactive storytelling and activities. Each session explores themes such as courage, self-acceptance, and love. These messages and values are reinforced with art, crafts, skits, and play, all conveying the message that children can be the heroes of their own stories.

THE GIVING TREE PROGRAM- FIRST LEVEL INTERVENTION

For children in crisis shelters, hospitals, or child-friendly police stations, storybooks serve as a gentle first step toward healing. Through mini-**Magic Crate Libraries (MCLs)** and **Happiness Parcels**, we deliver imagination where it's needed most. For many, a single storybook filled with illustrations becomes the first step toward safety, comfort, and hope.

BOOKWALLAH ADVENTURES PROGRAM

This program allows children to experience the world outside their libraries and orphanages through the lens of imagination. Each field trip connects stories with real-world experiences, introducing new happy memories and building confidence, empathy, and joy. It helps children see a world beyond their walls that can be beautiful, safe, and full of wonder.

STORY AMBASSADOR-BUDDY PROGRAM – BIG BROTHER BIG SISTER

We engage and train a variety of local volunteers from diverse backgrounds to lead our initiatives. Our Story Ambassadors are more than just facilitators; they embody the roles of mentors, elder brothers, and sisters. Their involvement sends a powerful message of inclusivity, affirming to the children that they are worthy of attention and love and can be significant contributors to our community.

RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT – EVALUATION PROGRAM

Our IRB-approved research studies utilize both quantitative and qualitative methods to assess how storybooks aid children in healing from trauma. We monitor changes in hope, self-perception, and behavior over an 8–9-month period of story sessions. These insights not only demonstrate the impact of our programs but also enable us to tailor Bookwallah’s initiatives for each child and location, thereby strengthening outcomes and ensuring the effectiveness of every story session.

LEADERSHIP PROGRAM & INTERNSHIP

Through our Leadership Program and Internships, children who demonstrate multi-dimensional progress in hope scores and other qualitative and quantitative measures are given the opportunity to manage and lead story sessions. They can also intern for Bookwallah in various departmental roles, fostering their development and engagement.




THE SCIENCE BEHIND THE STORY

Between July 2024 and February 2025, Bookwallah assessed **267 children across 11 Imagination Havens (libraries)**, measuring each child's progress **against their own baseline** after **just 30 story sessions**.

Our research, conducted through IRB-approved surveys, indicates that stories have significant potential to promote healing and rebuild emotional resilience and hope in children who have experienced trauma. These findings are also instrumental in helping us enhance the effectiveness of our story sessions.

Why this Matters: Research shows that higher Hope scores are strongly correlated to positive outcomes for the child and for society.

- 57% of children maintained or increased their own Hope Scores — showing measurable emotional stability and growth in a short span.
- 43% improved their Hope Scores, with the average rising from 27.32 to 27.56 — an upward shift in belief and optimism (positive outlook for life) even within complex trauma contexts.
- 14% showed gains in both Hope and Self-Perception, reflecting emerging self-belief and inner confidence with more time.
- Across 2,473 post-session check-ins, 93% of children reported feeling “happy” or “very happy” immediately after storytelling sessions — a powerful indicator of emotional engagement and joy through stories.

OUR VOLUNTEER TEAM – 96% OF OUR FORCE

In 2024, our volunteers lit the path forward with extraordinary heart. 158 individuals from local communities came together to share their time, creativity, and care—some for a year, and others who've stood beside us for more than 13 years. They are not simply part of Bookwallah; they are the heartbeat of this movement.

Because of their dedication, **our mission is powered by 96% volunteer team members**, allowing us to channel every dollar/INR with precision and purpose to areas we need most.

It takes soul to keep showing up in the face of challenges, especially in places where resources, environment can feel fragile. When we witness our dedicated volunteer teams stepping forward—ready to read, build, and bridge divides—it reminds us that what we are creating together is more than a program. It's a community of compassion shaping a brighter world, one story at a time.

In 2024, our volunteer team members' **Net Promoter Score was 81%** which is industry excellence. Our annual retention rate was 78%.



The Nightingale



BOOKWALLAH STORY- JYOTI'S STORY

From orphanage to international runways.

We met Jyoti when she was just 12 years old, living in an orphanage (girls' home) where we have the "Swan Lake" library. Even then, she had a quiet strength and a spark in her eyes that hinted at something extraordinary. She was the "model" many of the younger girls at this orphanage looked up to. Our story sessions needed to be a little "controlled" with the girls bouncing around. Jyoti was there to help despite her own tough journey of having lived in the streets.

Today, that same girl is modeling internationally thanks to her supporters such as Amin Sheikh who employs her at the Bombay to Barcelona Library Cafe.

She's walking runways, breaking barriers, and showing the world what resilience looks like. But more than that—she's living proof of what happens when children are seen, believed in, and given the space to dream and imagine.

Bookwallah is a reminder that their story is not the pain of past, but a new story of hope for the future.


